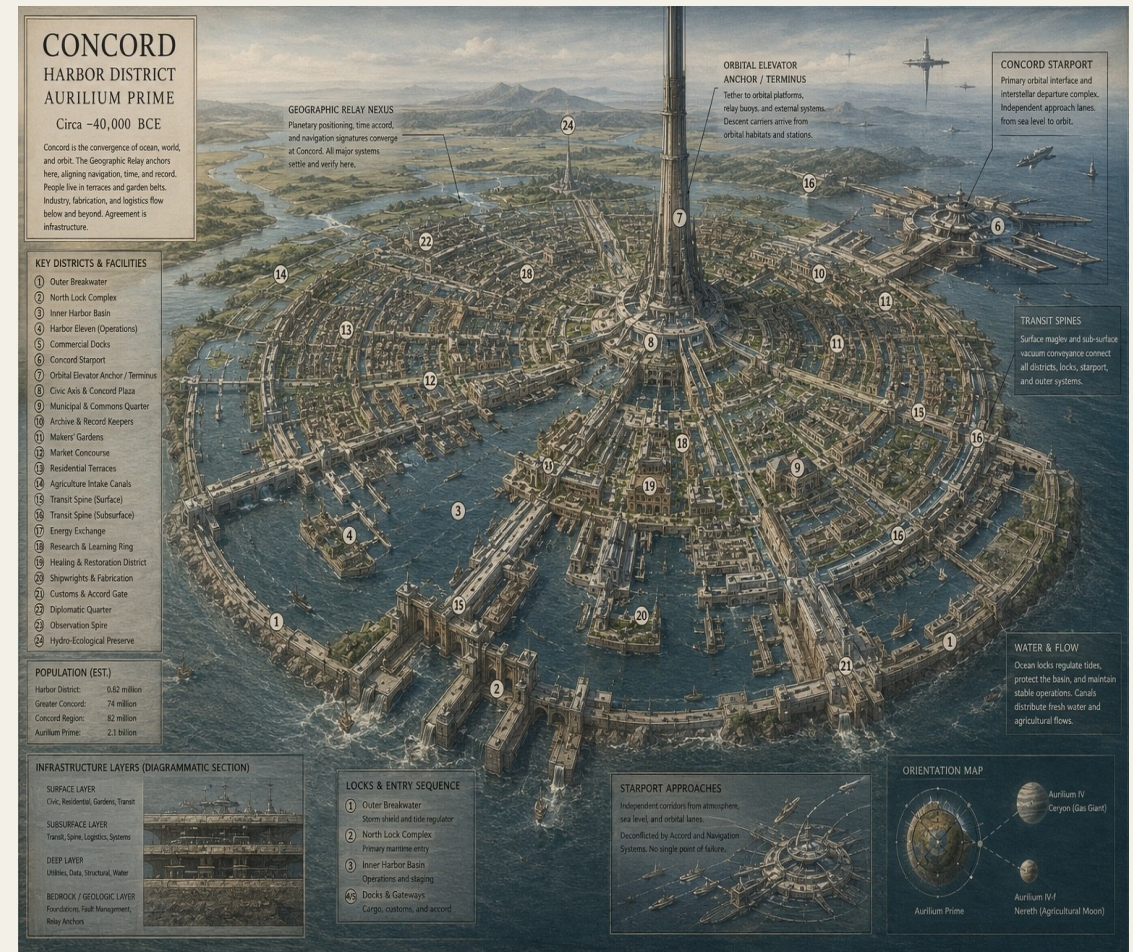

THE FIRST FRACTURE

THE DAY EVERYTHING DISAGREED.

A maintenance advisory arrives in a language no system recognizes. Relay clocks contradict one another. Records alter themselves. Navigation solutions diverge. Authenticated instructions cease to correspond to reality.

Each anomaly looks local — until the civilization's shared account of the world begins to come apart.

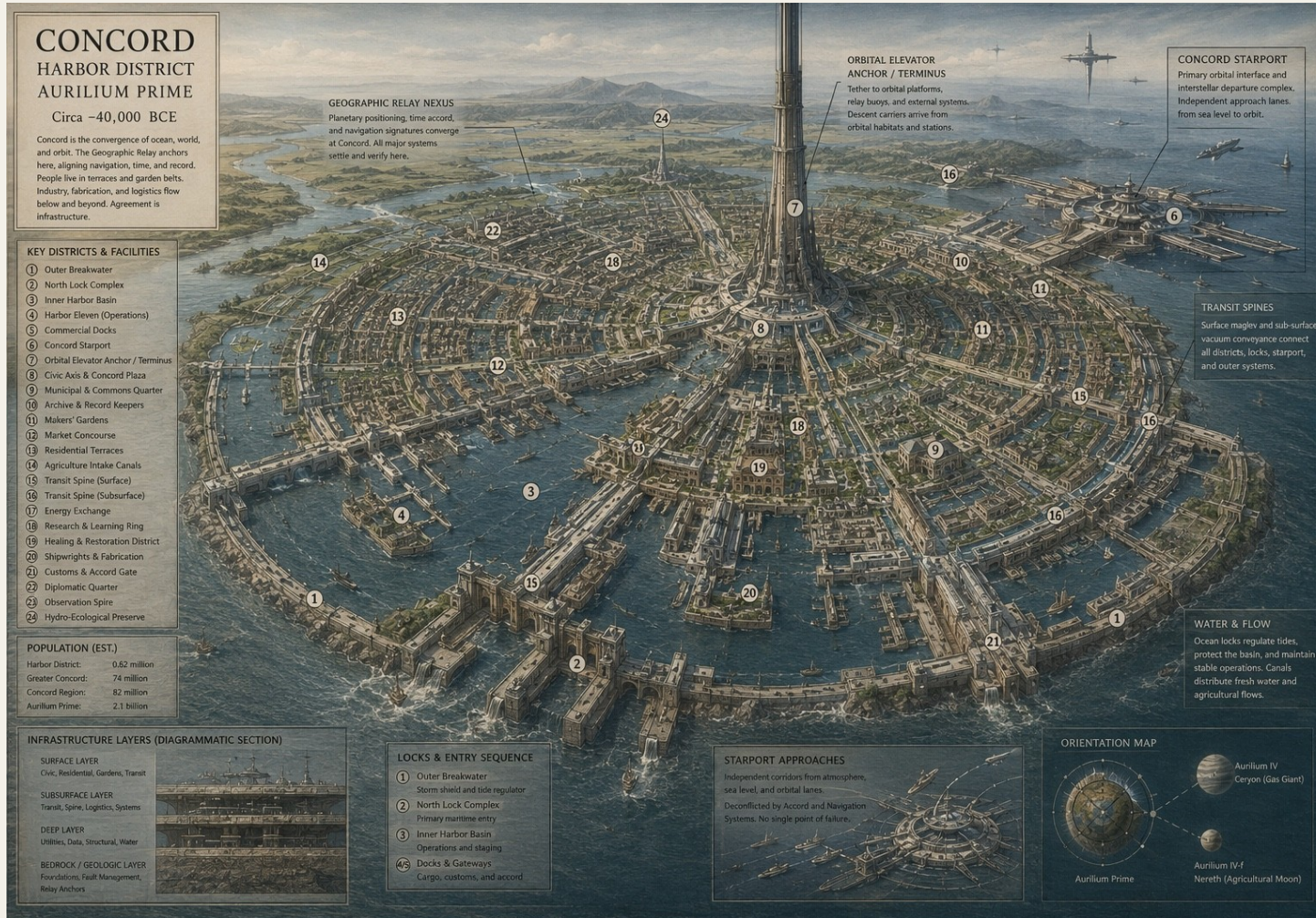

THE AEONTIC ERA

25,000–45,000 YEARS OF REBUILT CONTINUITY

By the Aeontic era, continuity is no longer an archival concern. It is infrastructure.

The Bridge of Concordance, distributed archives, relay custodians, harbor stewards, archivist navigators and recovery vessels exist because civilization has learned what happens when the record cannot be trusted.

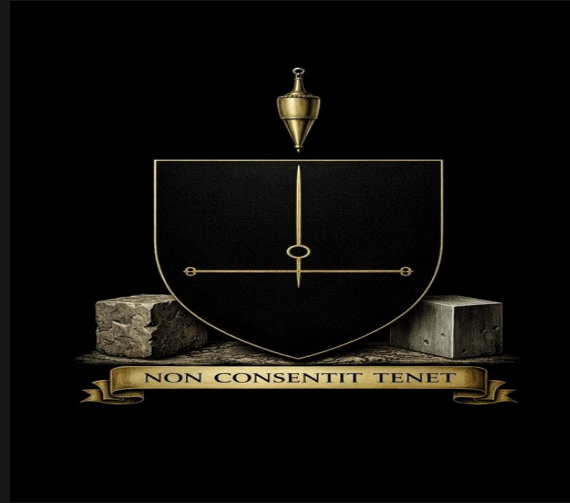


CURRENT MASTER: 29,670 WORDS
